4 DRIVER APPAREL

4.1 Driver's apparel shall be as specified in AASA Appendix 4 Apparel Requirements for Speed Events – Testing

5 VEHICLE AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

5.1 Vehicles must comply with the AASA NCR's and the AASA Event Operations Manual.

5.2 Vehicles must be event ready with all loose items removed from the vehicle.

6 SCRUTINY

6.1 Scrutiny will begin at 8.30AM . Please bring your completed pre-scrutiny form if applicable.

6.2 Vehicles entered in the event must have passed scrutiny prior to participating in any track activities Scrutiny will be as per section 7 of the AASA Event Operations Manual.

6.3 Current competition licences and driving apparel including helmets must be presented at scrutiny. Vehicles which suffer damage must be re-examined before entering the track again.

7 TIMING

7.1 Please note that there is no timing allowed at this event

8 PASSENGERS

8.1 Please note that passengers must be attired to the same standard as drivers, and must have completed and signed the passenger indemnity form.

9 EVENT FORMAT

9.1 Events Commence at 10.30AM and end at 4.00PM with 1 hour for lunch

10 FACILITIES

10.1 Powered & non powered camp sites are \$15 per night Shower Block hot & cold showeres

11 NOISE

11.1 The maximum noise limit is 94dba measured at 30 metres.

11.2 Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course. Any car found to exceed the maximum noise emission limit will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of Course is satisfied that action has been taken to bring it within the limit. Any vehicle that exceeds the limit on two runs will be excluded from the remainder of the event.

12 SMOKING

12.1 Smoking in the pit areas is prohibited. ONLY in the designated area in the Drivers Briefing enclosure

13 DRUGS & ALCOHOL

13.1 Consumption of alcoholic liquor by drivers or pit crew is forbidden prior to the completion of the event in accordance with Schedule 3 of the NCRs. Any entrant deemed by the Clerk of Course to be under the influence may be excluded from any on track activities and may be removed from the venue.

14 FUEL

14.1 NO FUEL available at the circuit Fuel can only be stored in 20 litre fuel drums or containers that meet AS1940/AS/NZS2906 or higher in order to comply with relevant State regulations. There is a maximum of 2 x 20 litre containers per bay at any one time.

14.2 Refueling must take place outside of garages/carports. All drivers, crew, and passengers must be outside of the vehicles while refueling. A crew member should be on stand-by holding a fire extinguisher during the refueling process for a hot vehicle.
